
GEOGRAPHIC "BIG IDEAS" AND ASSOCIATED WORLD REGIONS



These Big Ideas are the topics for a 12-chapter "untext." (It is called an untext because it does not even try to be a comprehensive "treatment" of each world region.)

It also makes no effort to "feel" like a mystery or romance novel. It is designed to support other readings, videos, websites, etc. The goal is to help students put other sources into perspective.

Each chapter has a one-page explanation of a Big Idea in geography, a brief rationale for choosing a particular region of the world to illustrate the Big Idea, and nine one-page descriptions of some logical consequences of the Big Idea.

The pages are illustrated with primary documents, photos, and maps. Most of the maps come from clickable electronic "mini-atlases" that were designed to depict features related to the Big Idea.

Here are six ways to use the "untext."

- 1. Read it for background and summarize it for students, using local examples and illustrations.
- 2. Read it for background and incorporate the ideas into other activities or presentations.
- 3. Assign it and use a quiz to assess understanding.
- 4. Assign it and have students make a journal summary.
- 5. Assign individual pages to individual students to read and share or report back to the whole class, orally or with a presentation, poster, newsletter, etc.,
- 6. Present the ideas in your own way, and assign pages to those students who need more scaffolding.
