

Getting a population pyramid from the Census.gov website

1. Go to <https://www.census.gov/population/international/data/idb/informationGateway.php>

(Later, you might try grouping several countries into a region.)

4. Select the **year** of the population pyramid you would like to see.
(Later, you might try grouping several years together.)

5, 6. **Ignore** these options for now.

7. Click **Submit** to see your pyramid
