OUTLINE 6th Grade Social Studies Network - 2015-6 Unit 6 – Political Geography (Empires, Colonies, Conflict, Cooperation) –

Note: Lessons 1-3 of MCCC Unit 7 do not directly address Michigan GLCEs for 6th grade world geography, but teachers might find them useful to help meet civics GLCEs. In this Geography Unit we focus on several broad issues of political organization that can also serve as organizing frameworks for a review of basic ideas from earlier units. Specifically, we review ideas about environment in Part A, resources and trade in Part B, causes of conflict in Part C, and international cooperation in Part D.

Part A – Empires – (MCCC Unit 6, lesson 4 Imperialism, Unit 7 Lessons 1-3 Governments)

Part B. Colonies (MCCC Unit 6, Lesson 4, Colonies)
